This year's theme, "Gender Equality in Digital Transformation," calls attention to the pressing need for inclusive digital ecosystems that empower all, regardless of gender.

This year's observance holds special significance as it marks the 160th anniversary of the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) – a milestone in the ongoing journey to connect the world and shape inclusive digital futures.
